## **they arrived by boat ... but came in on boards**

Imagine. You start out on a voyage, but arrive clinging to a board!

This was Paul's experience, recorded in Acts 27. I am fascinated by this white knuckle account of the apostle. This was not the story of an upwardly mobile benefactor of faith, but the account of an intrepid servant of God's kingdom who embraced daily realities face on.

He was to stand before Caesar in Rome and was taken on an Alexandrian ship with other prisoners under the watch of a centurion. 276 were on board. Conditions for the journey were horrendous as they followed the coast, then open waters through several stormy days.

At one point the ship was held together by ropes. Cargo, tackle and even food had to be thrown over just to get near land. But eventually it came close ... some could swim to shore. Paul came in on a board! You see, one night earlier during a storm, an angel of the Lord appeared to Paul and assured him that he would appear before Caesar and that all on the boat would be saved. The larger purpose of the expedition would be accomplished even if the boat itself fell to pieces!

Two insights life-clinging truths I get from this: **Insight 1:** How the journey starts is not how the journey ends. **Insight 2.** Expect God's intervening revelation to come through during your stormy journey!

To me this boat is like a metaphor of church programs, ministry methods or tools. They are simply 'vehicles' that serve us for a season in the accomplishment of prevailing kingdom purposes. They last a while, then need renewal. We may get a little more life out of them by holding them together with ropes, but eventually these 'vehicles' must be abandoned for new ones. 'Vehicles' such as buildings, clergy roles, charitable fundraising and even discipleship programs all have a place, but we must employ them nimbly, giving way to the larger movements of the Kingdom.

This is the quest of 'simple churching.' To keep tuned to the indwelling leading of Christ, being nimble with all vehicles that reflect the day in which we live, embracing the risks, not fearing man, but fearing God.
